PRIME MINISTER MODI'S RUSSIA VISIT—" INDIA IN FAVOR OF PEACE "

14TH JULY 2024

Prime Minister Narendra Modi is on a two-day visit to Russia. During his stay, he had an important meeting with President Vladimir Putin at his official residence in Moscow. PM Modi asked President Putin to end the war in Ukraine, emphasizing that fighting won't solve anything and that talking and negotiating are the only ways to find a solution.

PM Modi also raised concerns about Indian nationals who were tricked by dishonest travel agents into joining the Russian army. He stressed the need to bring these individuals back home safely, and Russia has promised to do so.

This visit is notable as it is PM Modi's first to Russia since the war in Ukraine began and since he won his third term as Prime Minister. President Putin congratulated him on his re-election, praising India's growing economy. This marks their 16th meeting over the past decade, showing the strong ties between the two leaders.

INCESSANT RAINS IN MUMBAI

Mumbai is facing heavy rains that have caused major disruptions. Schools are closed, and train services are



suspended in some areas due to waterlogging. Some parts of Mumbai received over 300 mm of rain in just six hours. The India Meteorological Department (IMD) has issued a 'red' alert, predicting more heavy rain. On Monday, Mumbai saw the second-highest rainfall in July, with nearly 300 mm in just six hours. Central Railway services including local trains have been affected inconveniencing thousands of passengers trains stopped on tracks for hours. Flight services are also facing disruptions due to low visibility and waterlogging on the runways. Schools in Mumbai and nearby areas like Thane, Navi Mumbai, and Pune are closed today due to the weather alert.



NEW CRICKET COACH OF INDIA

Gautam Gambhir will be India's new head coach, succeeding Rahul Dravid, who led India to victory in the T20 World Cup 2024. The announcement was made by BCCI secretary stating that "Gambhir's clear vision for Team India, coupled with his vast experience, positions him perfectly to take on this exciting and most sought-after coaching role. successful, having reached the finals of both the World Test Championship and the ODI World Cup last year, and winning the T20 World Cup. Gambhir has previously been a mentor for IPL teams Kolkata Knight Riders and Lucknow Super Giants. During his playing career, he played key roles in India's

victories in the 2007 T20 World Cup and the 2011 ODI World Cup, and captained KKR to two IPL titles.
